




Need for Lasting Affordability

U.S. Rental Housing Stock





Inclusionary Housing



Any land use policy that requires or incentivizes the creation of affordable housing when new development occurs, including impact or linkage fees that generate revenue for affordable housing.



Inclusionary Housing: Scale and Impact




Over 1,500 programs in over 900 jurisdictions







Community land trust owns land


CLTs: Scale and Impact

Lower price at resale





- Disposition of public land
- Housing Trust Fand
- HOME and SDBG funds
- Housing bond or tax
 - Local impact fees

Inclusionary housing in-lieu fees



Lasting Affordability Audit: Example



Pittsburgh Rental Gap Program

- Minimum affordability term: 30 years
- Priority for permanent affordability (99 years)



Lasting Affordability Audit: Example



Seattle Housing Levy


- Minimum affordability term: 50 years
- Funds operations and maintenance for affordable housing
