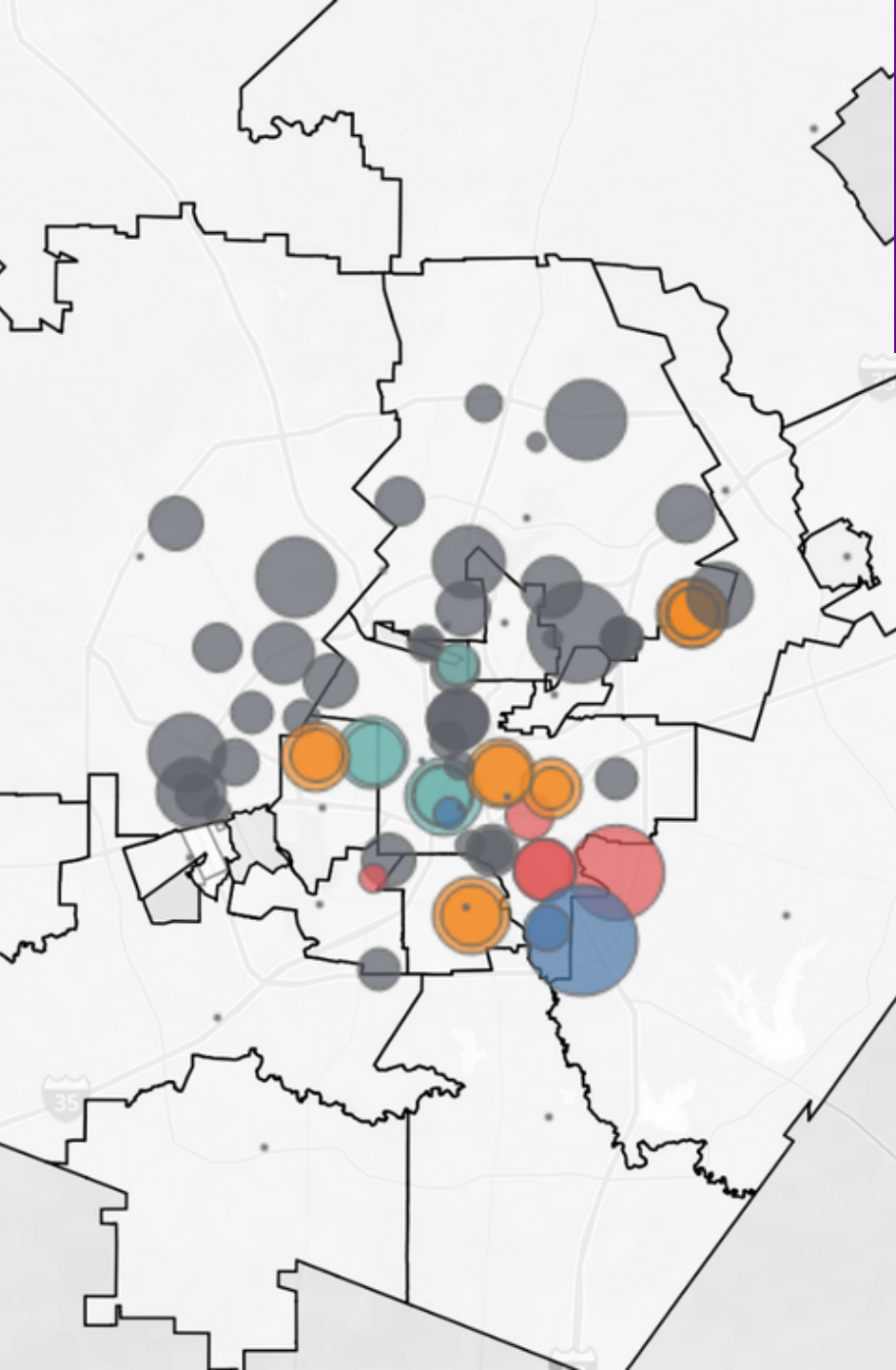

San Antonio's Education Landscape: The Gordian Knot

- 17 Public School Districts
- Over 40 Public Charter Organizations
- Over 600 Public Schools
- 300,000 public school students
- 100,000 students in public districts and public charters within the urban core



Just 50% of urban core high school grads matriculate into college

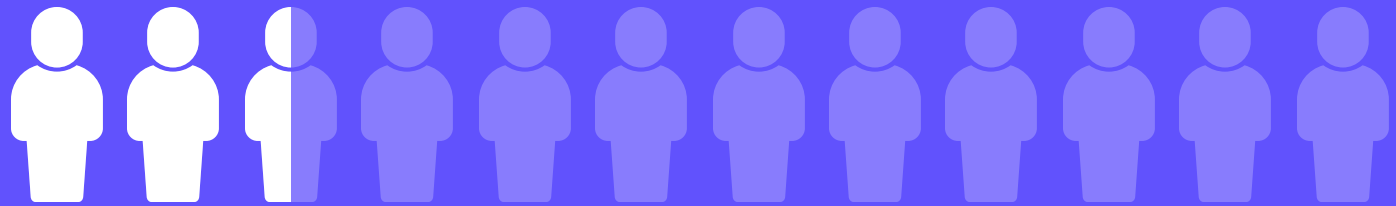


Fewer than 40% of those who matriculate complete college

20% of teachers in the urban core turnover every year

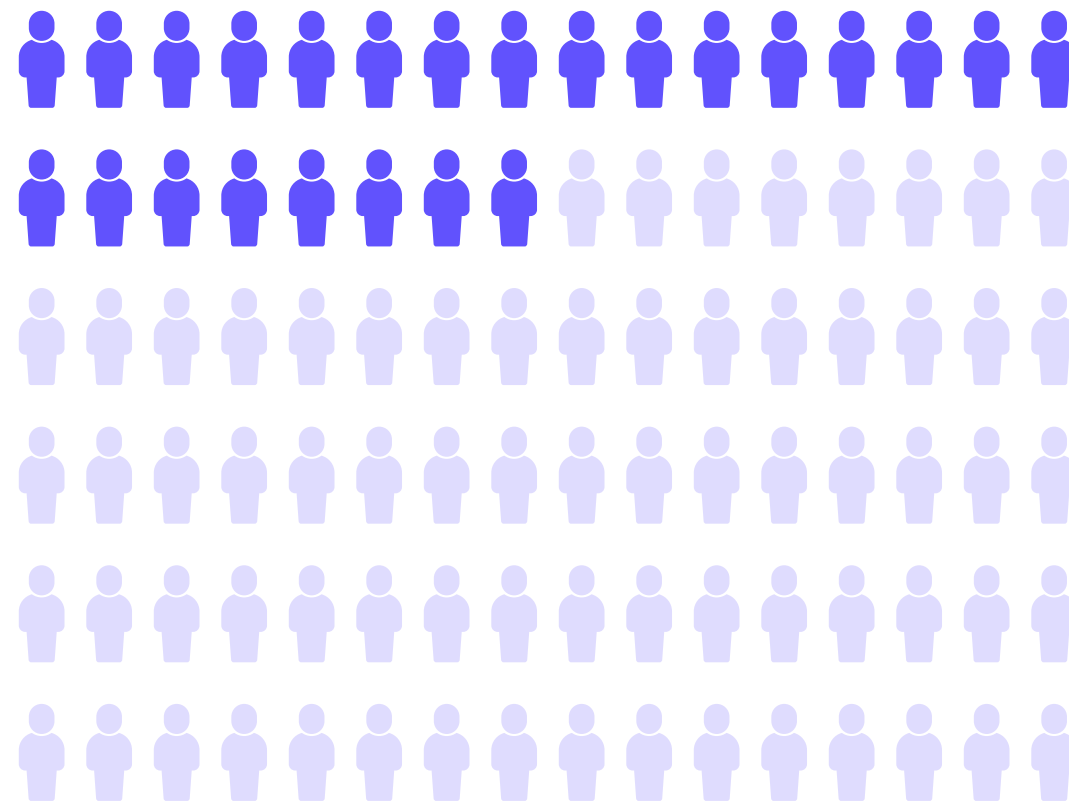

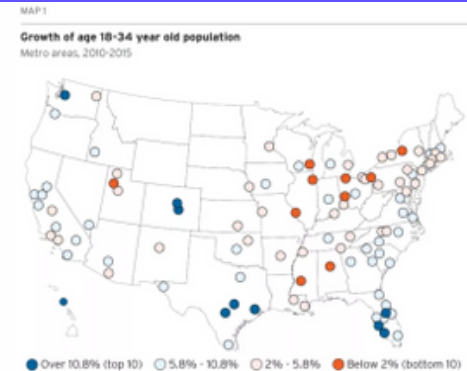
