Agar Grove: Exploring themes of community investment and energy efficient homes: Largest Passivhaus development in the UK, with 496 new homes, 236 affordable for Camden Council as part of their Community Investment Programme. Agar Grove is tenure blind, with no distinction between the build quality of the market sale, affordable and social housing.

King's Cross Regeneration: Exploring TOD, urban planning and transformation: Explore the transformation of King's Cross in which this transport hub has provided connectivity, contributing to one of the largest urban regeneration projects integrating housing, retail and leisure to create a vibrant, inclusive setting.

Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park: Exploring TOD, urban planning and transformation: Mixed-use development located on former rail land in East London featuring a mix of residential, retail, commercial and community spaces. Creative and thoughtful master planning of the site led to its role in securing London the right to host the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games. We will explore the ongoing transformation of the area into a home for cultural, educational and media businesses, alongside meeting the acute need for more housing, bringing regeneration to a formerly deprived area of London.

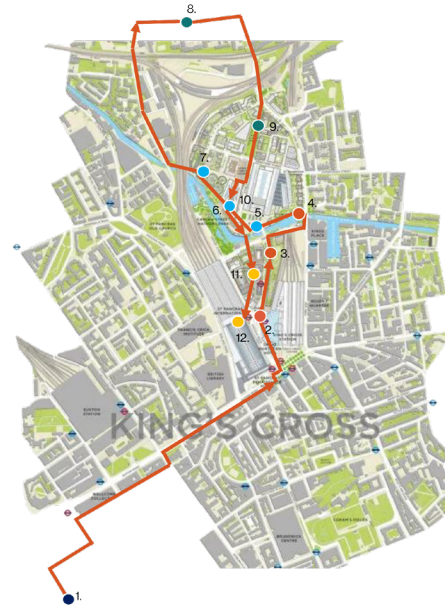

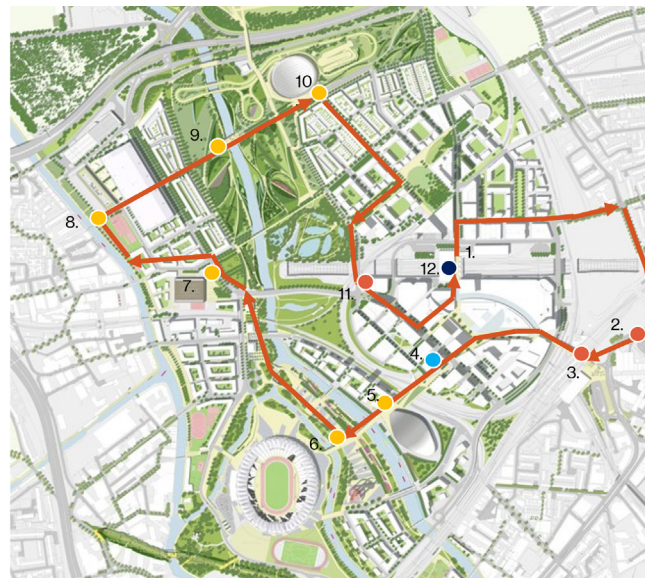
