• BDC is committed to a more equitable economy by supporting minority and women-owned businesses and promoting investment in neighborhoods that have been negatively impacted by institutional racism and/or generational poverty. We develop strategies and facilitate collaboration among our partners to intentionally create an inclusive and equitable economy.

COVID-19 Response & Recovery



The four main components of the **Response and Recovery Plan**:



Ensuring inclusion & equity has been a priority.

COVID-19 Response & Recovery

OUTREACH:

- Launched an online survey immediately with over 700 responses.
- Each survey participant was contacted by phone as a follow up.
- BDC mapped the outreach to ensure equitable coverage across the city and identifying areas that may need more direct outreach.

INFORMATION:

- Launched a new Baltimore Together website with over 26,000 visits.
- Conducted a webinar with state and federal leaders with over 1,400 participants.
- 64% increase in BDC's website traffic.

COLLABORATION:

- BDC is leading a network of 18 organizations to provide outreach and technical assistance.
- Working with partners to provide language assistance.
- Working with City government on policies to support reopening.
- Working with state and federal partners.
- Part of Bloomberg Cohort for recovery.

ACTION:

- Over **\$15 million for business** recovery.
- \$550,000 Local Manufacturing for **Personal Protective Equipment** (PPE)
- \$1.5 million for Design for Distancing initiative to reconfigure 16 commercial districts.
- First round \$3.5 million for small business assistance grants with over 350 awarded. 74% to MBEs.
