historic rehabilitation are key to the success of the project. The restoration of the historic buildings meet the high standards and requirements of the Maryland Historic Trust and the National Park Service. Extensive care was taken to preserve the building's historic fabric and story and to meet the Secretary of the Interior's standards, while incorporating modern building systems and amenities. The architectural style is not lost on the commercial tenants, who chose to preserve many of the unique building features, such as original fire doors, historic metal safes, wood floors, interior windows, bead board and wooden beams. The historic industrial buildings feature open floor plans that expose the unique architectural aesthetics of their heavy-timber and masonry construction. The exterior spaces between the historic buildings create a courtyard for community events and outdoor seating, contributing to the
