The Hamlet, formerly known as the Emmanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church, is a meticulously transformed early 20th-century church located in the heart of Highlandtown, Baltimore. Leveraging the property's C-1 zoning, this architectural gem has been converted into ten boutique live/work apartments and a second-floor commercial space in the original sanctuary. Achieving federal and state historic tax credits, the Hamlet beautifully preserves the community's heritage while providing modern, sustainable living spaces. From the vibrant stained glass to the refinished hardwood floors, each apartment seamlessly blends historic charm with contemporary comforts. The Hamlet stands as a symbol of revival and cultural revitalization in Highlandtown, offering a unique live/work oasis that reflects the district's flourishing arts community while accommodating the needs of the modern workforce living in the Arts & Entertainment (A&E) District.
