Message From Leadership

On behalf of the Urban Land Institute of British Columbia (ULI BC) I am pleased to present our 2021 Annual Report. We are delighted to share with you some key insights into ULI BC, including noteworthy statistics, the leadership whom make up our organization, and the many initiatives that ULI BC offered to our membership, along with the new initiatives we launched in the last year. We are extremely proud of the work we achieved through another year of the pandemic and are pleased to share the achievements highlighted within this report.

I personally would like to thank our amazing leadership team for their continued support. They continued to offer our members and stakeholders with timely events and quality content. While continuing to offer only online programming throughout 2021, we were pleased with the thought leadership and connections we were able to offer, and we again, and again held a record number of events in the calendar year. Our attendance for these digital mediums remained consistent as well, engaging nearly 3000 members and non-members to our virtual offerings.

ULI BC was pleased to continue to offer collaborations with our colleagues in Seattle and Portland, as well as our colleagues in Canada – hosting events with ULI Alberta and ULI Toronto. We also collaborated with centres of ULI globally, including Building Healthy Places and ULI Greenprint Center for Building Performance. Additionally, ULI BC planned its launch of <u>UrbanPlan for High Schools</u> holding volunteer training for members whom will assist with facilitations and being a mock City Council. And to compliment this global platform of UrbanPlan that is unique to ULI, ULI BC was also successful in obtaining a grant that was awarded to a total of five District Councils to begin work to understand historic inequities and racial discrimination in land use, and to craft creative strategies to address the ongoing impacts of these policies on community health and wealth disparities. ULI BC committees continued to achieve tremendous success as well in 2021. Our Young Leaders Group maintained its own leadership committee of more than 20 young professionals, while also successfully being awarded and participating in the <u>Etkin Scholars Program</u>. Events & Virtual Programming

Virtual Programs & Initiatives

- Virtual programming continued to bring ULI BC the opportunity of cross-collaboration with other District Councils. Partnerships continued along the Pacific Northwest in the US along with the rest of Canada. We collaborated with ULI Northwest (Seattle & Portland), ULI Toronto, ULI Alberta, and along the entireWest Coast with ULI San Fransisco, ULI Los Angeles, ULI San Diego/Tijuana and ULI Orange County/Inland Empire
- ULI BC was also successful in working with our ULI National Initiatives and Centres including ULI Greenprint Centre for Building Performance
- Virtual events in 2021 included keynotes, panel discussions, mentorship, webinars, thought leadership, local and provincial public officials, coffeel conversations, networking, and more



Global Initiatives & Local Outreach

UrbanPlan for High Schools

- UrbanPlan harnesses the power of experiential learning to drive students to more deeply engage in the complex nature of land-use decisions and inspire them to take an active role as engaged citizens to create better communities
- UrbanPlan is an engaging simulation exercise in which participants—high school students, university students, public officials and community members—learn about the market and non-market forces that shape real estate development in our communities. Participants experience the challenging issues, private and public sector roles, complex trade-offs, and fundamental economics in play when proposing realistic land use solutions to vexing growth challenges
- ULI BC launched UrbanPlan for High Schools in the fall of 2021
 - call out for volunteers and one full-day training
 - teacher interviews and confirmation of three teachers / four classes in high schools



Partnership for Health Equity

- In August 2021, ULI BC was one of five ULI District Councils in the Americas Region to be selected to begin work to understand historic inequities and racial discrimination in land use, and to craft creative strategies to address the ongoing impacts of these policies on community health and wealth disparities
- ULI BC's goal under the Partnership for Health Equity Program is to break down the systemic barriers to housing for Indigenous, Black and other racialized populations in our Province.
 By convening key stakeholders and gathering critical data, we hope to facilitate critical forums and create tools for the local real estate sector that will improve access to safe, affordable housing and promote increased health, wellbeing and long-term social sustainability



Etkin Scholars Program

- The ULI Etkin Scholars Program, made possible by the philanthropic support of Bruce Etkin, introduces college and university students to the resources available through ULI membership and seeks to integrate those students into the ULI path of learning. Through this program, ULI District Councils will identify a cohort of students and provide the students with a welcoming and concrete entrée into ULI knowledge at the local and national level with funding support, free ULI student membership, creative programming, networking, and learning opportunities throughout the academic year of their scholarship. The students supported through this program shall be recognized as Etkin Scholars
- ULI BC was selected as one of five District Councils to participate
