Summit Tours | The Summit features a variety of tours for attendees to choose from! Select one of the three tours offered on July 27 and one of the seven tours on July 28. (Note that the Indiana Avenue tour is featured both days).

Wednesday, July 27 – Get to Know Indy!

Explore several of Indy's cultural districts through one of three tours. Tours depart the hotel at 2:30pm and conclude at approximately 4:30pm.



Walk & Talk Tour – Indiana Avenue

This walking tour will explore the rich history of Indiana Avenue, once a thriving hub of Black commerce and entertainment in Indianapolis.

CityWay/Fletcher Place

This walking tour stops at several sites, including:

- CityWay, an apartment and mixed use community.
- Briggs Flats Apartments, a historic Romanesque Revival building.
- A historic structure blended with modern elements to create the Indy offices of Milhaus, a mixed-use developer.
- Idle, a pocket park featured on CBS News.
- James Beard-acclaimed restaurants, and more!

Cultural Trail East

The Indianapolis Cultural Trail: A Legacy of Gene & Marilyn Glick, is an internationally recognized shared-use path/linear park connecting downtown districts. This walking tour explores multiple spots:

- Julia M. Carson Transit Center, Indy's hub public transit hub.
- Mass Ave., a five-block district featuring theaters, restaurants, art galleries, eclectic boutiques, and public art.
- Bottleworks District, a multi-use neighborhood incorporating the adaptive reuse of a historic, Art Deco Coca-Cola bottling plant with restaurants, shopping, entertainment, and a hotel.

Departs from hotel at 4pm by bus and will return by 6pm




Hoosier Heroines Tour

Central State Redevelopment

Once a hospital that served those suffering from mental illness, the Central State campus is being redeveloped to create a mixed-use village. Since 2007, the area has seen more than \$80 million in public, private, and non-profit investment resulting in a charter school, track and field, new roads and infrastructure, multi-family housing, single-family housing, and a new senior living facility. This walking tour will include stops at the apartments for HVAF Indiana (Helping Veterans And Families), the historic Laundry Building, the Medical History Museum, and more.

16 Tech/Riverside
