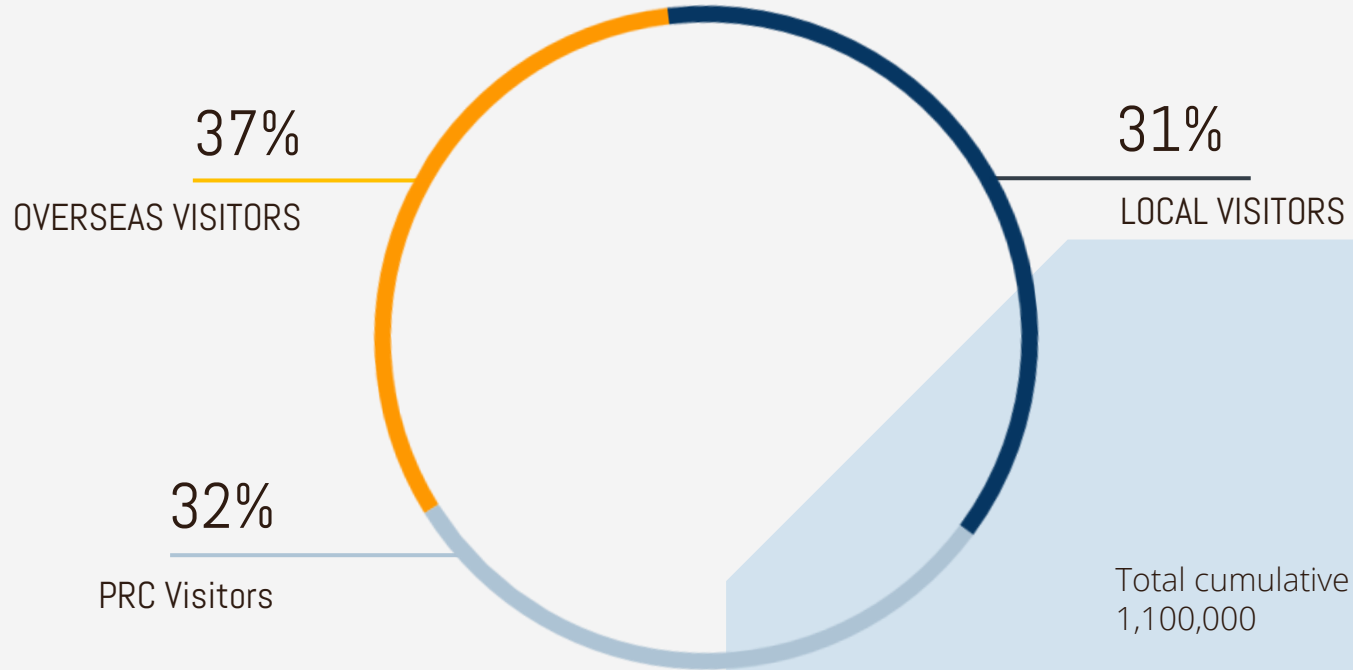

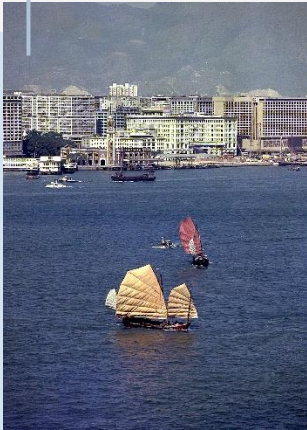

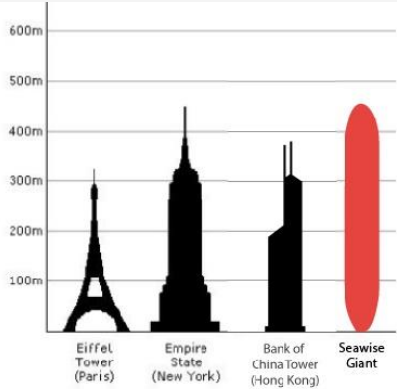

ARE YOU AWARE THAT



There is an internationally renowned Maritime Museum at Pier 8?

This wonderful cultural institution connects Site 3 with the waterfront?

The museum's extensive, high-quality collection tells the centuries-old story of the development of Hong Kong into a global port city?

Since 2013, the Hong Kong Maritime Museum (HKMM) is located at Central Pier No. 8. Our mission is to be the Hong Kong-based centre of excellence for exploring local and regional maritime interests. We have 15 galleries displaying over 1,000 objects. We offer a wide range of educational programmes for students and public throughout the year, and tailor learning experiences with tertiary institutions. The HKMM operates on a private-public-partnership model with partial funding from the Government and revenue streams from admission tickets, venue hire, fundraising, the museum shop, and a social enterprise café.

Access and Physical Connectivity

The HKMM is a meeting place, where visitors feel safe, welcomed, comfortable and entertained. For a meeting place, access and connectivity are key. Pier 8 is a transportation hub – all land transports including the MTR, bus, minibus, and taxi are within a 10-minute walk. The adjacent roundabout also serves as a hop on/hop off tour bus stop. In addition to the current ferry services, sea transport accessibility is further improved by the arrival of the water taxi. The Central Business District is only a bridge away.

Civic Programs in Public Spaces

The HKMM is more than a museum – with a plethora of activities ranging from dance and music, conferences, food and beverages, to exhibitions. The HKMM is very much community-based and provides free events all year round in the peripheral area of Pier 8. In other words, the museum has been very much involved in organising civic programs in public spaces. On land, there have been exhibitions and educational programmes, themed islands culture, biodiversity, rowing heritage and outdoor sculpture installations on shark conservation. On sea, we have hosted various international vessels – a 1927 Norwegian Three-mast tall ship, a French ocean research schooner and a clean-energy run *Race for Water*.

Over the past half year, the museum entered a new phase with the appointments of a new Chairman, a new Museum Director, and a new focus on a long-term ocean conservation educational programme for students and the green NGO community. The HKMM is proud to announce the upcoming installation of the Swire Marine Discovery Centre, to be opened in 2022. This newly designed Centre will enable the Museum to roll three museums into one – focusing on History, Arts and Science. Looking into the future, as part of Site 3 we propose an impressive Maritime Plaza to the Hong Kong community, with the world's largest anchor as its centerpiece.

The museum has been supportive in the New Central Harbourfront discussions by co-organising “The Harbourfront Forum – How to Plan a Harbourfront for the People” (2018) and hosting an ULI discussion event “Shaping Hong Kong New Central Harbourfront” (2017). We welcome interested parties to continue the dialogue and reach out to the Museum for possible future partnerships.

Heritage and Cultural Resources

The very nature and objectives of the museum mean that, the involvement of the HKMM in future development plans brings invaluable resources to Site 3. The Museum is THE cultural institution *par excellence* where people from Hong Kong, mainland China and the rest of the world will be informed about and connected with the past, present and future of Hong Kong's waterfront and harbour. Including the museum in this exciting Central Waterfront development will create unmeasurable added value.

We would be delighted to present our ideas and discuss inspirations for Site 3 with other participants when there is opportunity to meet.
