Hosted ULI Atlanta's second annual <u>Housing Innovation</u> <u>Summit</u> with a focus on small and mid-scale development innovation and how it is being implemented across the Atlanta region. Atlanta was selected as the host city for ULI's <u>Housing Opportunity Conference</u> in February 2025.
- **Through Partnerships**. ULI Atlanta partnered with Georgia Tech and hosted the <u>GA Tech Real Estate Development Conference</u>.
- Across Geographies. Maximized opportunities for statewide partnership through our <u>Technical Assistance Program (TAPs)</u> and UrbanPlan programs which we've delivered in Augusta, GA; Columbus, GA; Rabun Co, GA; and Warner Robins, GA. Continued partnership with ULI Charlotte through the annual Capital Markets Exchange and hosting the <u>Georgia +</u> <u>Carolinas reception</u> at ULI's Fall Meeting in Las Vegas.
- **Digitally.** Cultivated visibility opportunities for ULI members and programs through #MemberSpotlight's on social media, articles on <u>ULI</u> <u>Atlanta's blog</u>, producing our <u>monthly newsletter</u>, and marketing ULI's learning and on-demand courses and webinars.

- Elevated thought leadership on key ULI mission priorities by hosting our first ever <u>Southeastern Coastal Development Forum</u> in partnership with ULI NE Florida and ULI South Carolina convening members along the Georgia Coast for a 2 day conference in Savannah, GA.
- Educated the next generation of diverse leaders through the <u>Etkin</u> <u>Scholars program</u> designed to introduce college and university students with a real estate interest and degree focus to the resources available through ULI membership.
