
Leverage ULI's respected voice on land use issues to drive decisions that promote sustainability, equity, economic development, and a high quality of life across the region.

How do ULI Boston priorities elevate and amplify ULI's global priorities?

HOUSING ATTAINABILITY

- Expand access to ULI learning for public sector members
- Explore housing-focused UrbanPlan for public sector and communities
- Implement the Mobility Oriented Development initiative
- Expand the Housing Roundtable to include employer perspectives on the housing crisis
- Convene the major stakeholders to explore all potential housing solutions
- Provide storytelling tools to members to build community support for housing

DECARBONATIZATION AND NET ZERO

- Explore opportunities to enhance the value of the MBTA to riders and land use planners/ developers
- Leverage ULI's national and global research and reports for local programming
- Revisit past work, including Living with Water and Living with Heat, to explore implementation opportunities

INFORMING LEADERS

- Leverage UrbanPlan differentiating goals for high school, university, public officials, and community
- Utilize UrbanPlan to get members in front of decision makers to demonstrate development tradeoffs

- Help members reconnect to ULI when creating small scale development ventures
- Distill big topics/reports down to onepagers; share via Sitelines or on social media

WHAT'S NEXT?

With fulfillment of ULI's global mission priorities at the forefront, ULI Boston/New England is developing an implementation framework that aligned its core programming needs identified in the member survey with the major focus areas for the Boston/New England District Council to map out a plan of execution. These core issues

underpin ULI Boston/New England's work for 2024 and beyond by leveraging member leadership, member engagement, educational programming, and thought leadership on complex real estate and land use issues. Each initiative will be evaluated on an annual basis on the degree to which the initiative will drive membership,

revenue, and community impact. The ULI Boston/ New England Executive Director will routinely make an assessment of staff and district council resources required to ensure feasibility. Through this framework, member leadership can assess how their respective committees are advancing ULI's strategic priorities.
