Summary

The City's 2021-2029 Liousing Element (also known as the Plan to House LA) identified significant housing needs throughout Los Angeles reflected by high rents, ovecroweled conditions, and housing instability. Recognizing the urgency of planning for equilative fluoising solutions for the City's residents, including permission thromes for the untroused and more allordable housing for those burdened by nousing costs. City Flanning has developed the <u>Clavice Housing Incentive</u> <u>Planning</u>, as one of the many ambibility programs within the Plan to House LA.

The <u>Housing Exament Nazoning Pingram</u>, called for by the 2021-2029 Housing Element, sets out to address these critical housing needs and meet the Chys housing obligations under state law in addition to recomings that will take place through Community Plan Updates, the Housing Element Rezoning Program ancempasies the Olivyide Housing Incentive Program (CHIP) The CHIP includes incentives to expand experimitifies for mixed choome and 100% affordable housing deviceprogram Ordenage will amont the Los Angeles Numicipal Code (LAMC) to enable streamined project review processing and introduce belo new incentives for eligible project types in order to expand access to affordable housing near transit loos, along confords, and in higher opportunity amas. In addition to Council member meetings and convening, our Local Product Councils also share their areas of knowledge and expertise with all ULI LA members through key events such as the annual Emerging Trends Panel, Homelessness Summit, and Housing Council Programs.
