




What do we do?

The Governor's Office Infrastructure Team's focus is to create long-lasting, sustainable, systematic change in how New Mexico designs, builds, and manages infrastructure. The infrastructure team will serve as the facilitator between implementation and investment by working as a liaison between federal, interstate, and NM state agencies, and by serving as a partner with tribal and local governments and private companies and nonprofits.

How do we do it?

By leveraging resources available to all communities and agencies, federal and state funds will be channeled locally, with an emphasis on capacity building and infrastructure resiliency now and for generations to come.






Snapshot of BIL Funding in NM


- •\$5.7 billion of BIL funding for New Mexico programs and projects as of September 2024, including:
 - •\$2.8 billion for transportation*
 - •\$1.2 billion for broadband
 - •\$1.billion for water
- •Other awards for pollution cleanup and well plugging.
- *\$2.8 billion in transportation over 5 years.
- *Transportation includes roads, bridges, airports, rail, transit and safety programs.
- *Water includes clean water, wastewater, stormwater.
- *Renewable Energy includes generation, transmission, and storage.





Inflation Reduction Act Highlights

- \$15 billion in large-scale clean power generation and storage.*
- More state, local and tribal government projects that qualify for IRA direct pay
- Resilient communities*




*\$15 billion by 2030.
