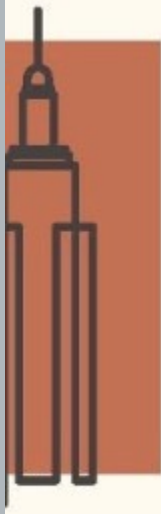

On Thursday, November 19th, ULI Pittsburgh partnered with AIA Pittsburgh to convene a group for a dynamic discussion aimed at women and diversity of thought in the built environment. This was a members-only event.

The program began with a presentation from AIA Member Erica Cochran Hameen, Ph.D., NOMA, Assoc. AIA, LEED AP, Assistant Professor at the Carnegie Mellon University School of Architecture (CMU SoA) and ULI Member, Valentina Vavasis, Valentina Vavasis Consulting Special Faculty Carnegie Mellon University (CMU).

The presentation was followed by breakout sessions/virtual roundtables in which the participants had candid conversations that were focused on 3 questions.

1. If we had no constraints, what would we do differently to overcome professional barriers? What are the actions we can take to make such changes?
2. If we had no constraints, what changes would we make to our built environment? What are the actions we can take to make such changes?
3. Who is not at today's discussion that you think should be? [We can actively solicit their attendance at the next event?]

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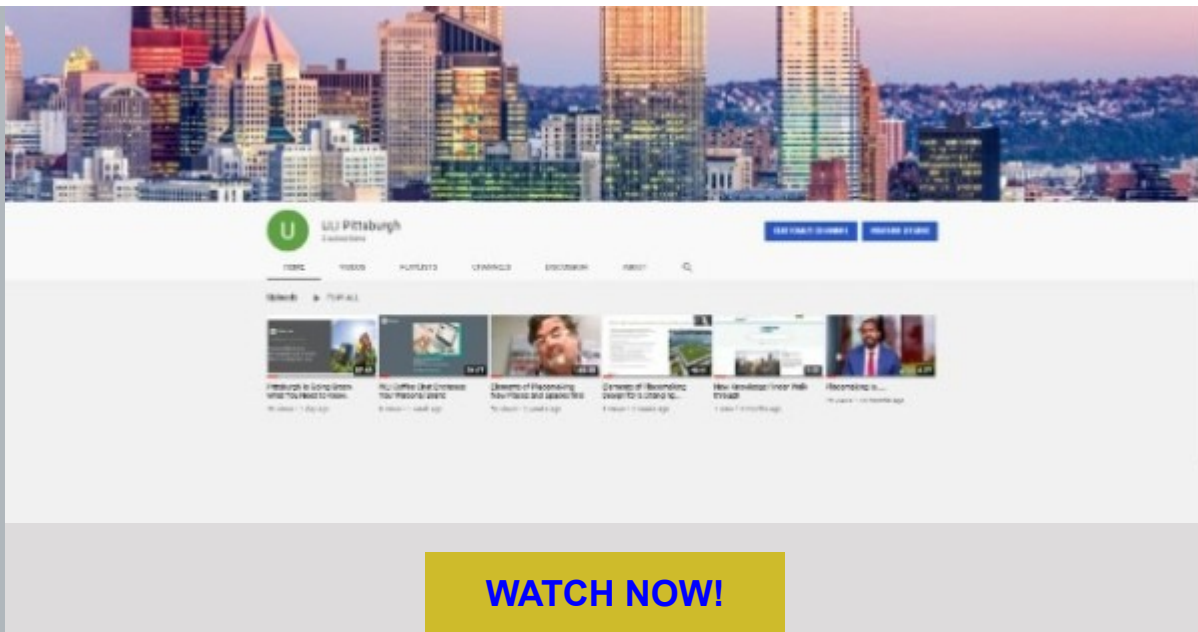
