The Need

- 58.2% of U.S. children in poverty live with a single mother. [1]
- •8.3% of U.S. children in poverty live with a single father. [1]
- •In the U.S., 62% of new moms in their early 20s are unmarried.^[2]
- More than 40% of single mother households live in poverty.^[2]
- In 2015, 31% of single mothers (25+) held a college degree, compared to 54% of married mothers and 40% of women overall.^[3]
